Two years ago we (the Church Leadership), with the full cooperation of the church, launched a three year vision. This was for £100,000 per year to be given each year above our regular tithe.


We are now in the third year!

It's almost impossible to record how many people we reach and serve now from Arena Church but it's multiple thousands each week.

When we talk about margin in the context of giving within Arena Church, we are speaking of the additional giving that enables us to have more than we need which then enables us to do more than we are presently doing!


Without margin we just maintain our present position! And without this giving we would not be able to do as much as we have done (read the stories in the brochure).

Live with an Eternal Perspective

This is a great question. All that we have in our heart to do is fuelled by a God given vision. You see people give to vision not need, and as we enter 2020 we do so with a God given vision in our heart and that is to **Establish**.

Establish the work of our hands for us, yes establish the work of our hands.
Psalm 90:17

Never doubt God's mighty power to work in you and accomplish all this. He will achieve infinitely more than your greatest request, your most unbelievable dream, and exceed your wildest imagination! He will outdo them all, for his miraculous power constantly energizes you.

The Passion Translation (TPT)

This word **establish** means to make strong, to found, to protect, to increase. We believe this is what God is wanting to do this year in 2020 which is a year of fulfilment. He's establishing what he's multiplying! This establishing will help us to dig deeper and lay a solid foundation that will enable us to build tall and expand wider in the years ahead!

We are called to keep establishing, continuously in the present tense - to never remain or get comfortable.

The Senior Leadership Team in the autumn of 2019 were praying over this word and I had a video call organised with a Pastor friend of mine from the USA. He knew nothing of our word for the year, nor of our discussion and prayer within the team and yet in the middle of our conversation he said "he felt the Lord say to him that this coming year in Arena was to be a year of 'establishing'. As the roots go down deep this will allow Arena to spread widely."

He then spent two minutes outlining what the Lord had given us a few weeks earlier. You can imagine my excitement at hearing this divine confirmation!

Establishing

This **establishing** means that we need to focus intentionally upon the following things:




To fund each new campus for the coming year with staff, resources, equipment and money to love and serve the people and their localities. This includes the rents, running costs and general monthly costs for another year as we ESTABLISH these works to enable them to become strong!

We also want to continue to strengthen and expand the strong ministry bases of Ilkeston and Mansfield. This includes the continual improvements of equipment and a particular emphasis in reaching children, youth, and seniors.

2 Community Transformation

To increase our practical community serving into all the locations - through food banks, housing, kids outreaches, clothing, meals, training and helps. Each campus has needs that are individual to their location and this money will give the team the resource needed to practically serve and make a difference.

Total £30,000





To add to the monthly giving that already comes from Arena Church tithe towards our Worldwide Ministry Partnerships where we serve thousands of people in other countries and continents.

Training & Development of New Leaders

Arena Ministry School... to the ends of the earth!

As well as the very important investment into the above three areas this year we also need to invest in the training, the development and the sending of new leaders through the building out of our ministry school base.

Our Arena Ministry School, already affectionately being called AMS, started January 2019 out of a desire to train, develop and send leaders. For us to lay a strong Bible foundation whilst giving the students practical tools that will enable them to better serve in whatever area they are being called to.

We were given the opportunity to acquire an old redundant engineering works 100 metres away from our Ilkeston campus - a real miracle! This was a step of faith by the leaders and in obedience we purchased the freehold site for £120,000 from general funds. We bought it knowing that we did not have the renovation money and that we would need approximately £100,000 to renovate and create a fantastic facility that trains leaders now and in the future.

We are now in our second year of training and we are believing that we will over the next decades train and send hundreds of leaders to make a difference in the world! Our influence is not restricted to the East Midlands but is to the ends of the earth! This bespoke facility will enable us to train and send for years to come! This is an exciting seedtime opportunity.



I am aware it's a big budget and a big ask but we serve a big God and you are a big hearted church! I understand the required need has grown by 100%, yet I for one feel so privileged to be able to be trusted with this work by God and for us to believe in faith for £200,000 given this year!

For some people God has been very good to you financially and we would ask that you consider sowing into this great fund. Some of you own successful businesses. Why don't you consider sowing into this offering from your business? This is tax deductible (seek accountants help and advice).

We as a church have been entrusted with more than we originally thought as we grew in 2019 from 2 locations to 6! This reminds me of the testimony of the late evangelist Reinhard Bonkke who distributed an evangelistic Christian book to every home in the UK in the early 1990s at a cost of nearly \$10 million.

When in prayer Reinhard asked the Lord why he was asking HIM to do this. He said that the Lord spoke to him and said that he had already asked another prominent person to do this and they had said no! He may have been the second choice but he committed to the work of God and amazingly in the financially hit years of the early 1990s, it was accomplished and the \$10 million needed was given.



From Easter to Christmas

Each year we attempt to bless our city with some actions in the community. At Easter we distributed chocolate boxes to people such as police officers, the town hall, the children's hospital, firemen, the rugby club and the football club. We received an acknowledgement from the mayor who thanked Arena Church for our presence and our actions towards the poor into the city.

On July 6th we organised a worship concert in a city centre night club in Toulouse with the Arena Worship Team. It was awesome to achieve a gathering of 200 people when we did not know anyone in this region of France when we first arrived. God was at work among all of us. The marketing manager of the concert room was astonished to see this kind of quality from a church. We were great ambassadors of Christ.

We finished our year on December 15th with our Christmas service, Carols by Candlelight. We praise God for all the events. We are praying for more this year.


We also sponsor children through the ministry of Compassion International in Mugumo Village in Kenya. This ministry is represented in our own church by Anne Basabe.

Additional £100,000 to renovate our Ministry School

We want to train empower and send people into the world. The estimated scope of work and costs to renovate the site are as follows:

- Renew the roof (it's presently asbestos sheets)
- New windows
- Full electrics, plumbing and heating.
- Build a mezzanine floor
- Build out offices
- Renovate a large classroom facility/hall with a fully equipped kitchen and coffee bar
- · Create a small library area
- Flooring
- Furniture
- · Landscaping and fencing

We have received some seed money from a select few people. Including the late Pastor Colin and Hazel Whittaker who also donated his extensive book collection for the school. We are looking for people who will invest into this valuable facility!







Frequently Asked Questions

What is Arena 2020 in short?

A 3 year fund, raising £100,000 per year to take the gospel to the world through Church Planting, Community Transformation, Leadership Training, and World Missions. 2020 is the third year of the fund.

How can I get involved?

By prayerfully considering pledging or giving to this fund each year.

How can I give?

You can give weekly, monthly, annually or in whatever frequency you would like but please ensure when you give that you clearly mark on the envelope or on your online payment "2020" so that we can ensure this money is restricted for this purpose. The easiest way to give is to set up a standing order if you are able.

Can I give the gift up front?

Yes. If you are a taxpayer we can claim Gift Aid of 25%, which means £100,000 from UK taxpayers gives us a massive £25,000 extra! Please complete a Gift Aid form which you can obtain from the Connect Point.

What happens if there is a surplus?

We desire to create a margin that would allow us to do so much more in these key areas. The more we give, the more we are able to sow into ministry locally, nationally and across the world.

Who administers the fund?

This fund is administered by the Financial Team of Arena Church and the Accountant auditors of Arena Church. It will be set aside as restricted funding for these areas only.

Will we still do the Mercy Offering?

No. This fund will replace the Mercy Offering.

Wow, what a testimony to the faithfulness of God, and yet we continue to believe and trust for more.

Please, can I ask that you consider giving your best to God in this offering. It may be that you have given an amount historically but could it be that God is asking you to do more this year?
