Welcome to Arena Community's First Edition of our newsletter.

Arena Community has been around since mid 2008 from very small beginnings which involved one pallet of food collected from local people. We started to serve people and this has grown from Ilkeston and is now in numerous locations across the region.

It now serves approximately 5000 people and children per month. It gives away tens of thousands of pounds of supplies - food, furniture, shoes, school uniforms, bedding , baby equipment each year to those who are struggling, hurting, have fallen upon difficult times and those presently making poor choices. We have a real need at the moment amongst the working people who are unable to stretch their money far enough due to the present cost of living.

WHAT WE DO:

IN BELPER:

We launched a parents and tots group in Belper every Wednesday morning in November last year. We wanted to reach out to parents with small children. It's great for them to come and meet other parents and children.

We have also been able to give out food hampers to parents within the group who are in need.

IN ILKESTON:

In October 2022 we moved the location of our foodbank to Mundy St. This was so we could make savings financially without reducing the service we offer.

We currently have nine tenants in our supported housing. The team have done an excellent job in redecorating and looking after the houses so that our tenants feel they have a well looked after and homely space to live in. Some of our tenants are currently enrolled in college courses while others are involved with different volunteering opportunities.

IN MANSFIELD:

At Mansfield the community team create a welcoming atmosphere to everyone who comes through the doors for Care for a coffee and Food Club.


At Care for a Coffee we serve tea, coffee, toast and cakes all free to everyone who comes. The pool tables continue to be well used by our guests and it's great to see so many friendships develop. This is often the highlight of the week for some and they don't want to go home.

The Food club parcels have 12 items of food in them and cost £3.50. It helps singles or families save up to £20 on their groceries. A lot of additional work is done by the team in the background by raising funds and also the 'unseen Monday team' who work hard to set everything up for the week ahead.

The continued generosity of Arena and the wider Mansfield community makes these possible.

IN NOTTINGHAM:

I am SO pleased to officially announce that we now have a fully functioning, fully working, ready to be used shower facility ready to go and grow and love and serve those who are seen to be unloveable. We have launched Shower Hour, which is exactly what it says on the tin, an hour of opening up the building, inviting those in who would benefit from a shower, cleaning facilities, a bite to eat, and a bit of connection with someone warm and friendly. This is a small thing. In the grand scheme of things - it's a very small thing. Only a little dent. But it's a start...

Q/ How did you get involved with Arena Church/Community?

A/ The school has a long standing relationship with Arena Church. For over ten years we've attended community services, which have enabled our children to showcase their performance skills and for us to share in the church's vitally important community messages.

Q/ Why do you feel it's important to get involved in Arena Church/Community?

A/ It's important for us all to feel a sense of belonging, to be part of something bigger than ourselves. Here at CJS we know that we have friends across town in Arena Church who will support us and look out for us and enable us to connect to a wider purpose. We love our involvement with the church and the many kind and generous people who run the whole Arena organisation, and who attend their services and wider functions.

CHRISTMAS GIVEAWAYS

Each year staff and volunteers at Arena Community, along with members of Arena Church, start fundraising and receiving donations in the last part of the year to continue to lift the level with how many children, families and elderly people they are able to provide food, gifts and donations at Christmas Time.

At Arena the team are very aware there are many who are lonely and in need and particularly in the Christmas season this can be a particularly difficult time for those who find themselves in this situation.

Through the staff and many volunteers, the help of local businesses, fundraising and donations; In 2022 Arena was able



to give away:-

925 selection boxes to local children305 childrens toys and gifts to families in need

260 Christmas hampers to the lonely, vulnerable and in need.
